Research Grant in Turkish languages or Turkology

The board of the SWEDISH RESEARCH INSTITUTE IN ISTANBUL hereby announces a fellowship grant of **12000 SEK** for the **fall term of 2019**.

The grant is awarded to individual researchers, or Candidate or Master students working on a thesis that would qualify them as such, within the field of Turkish languages or Turkology at Swedish or Nordic universities. Special attention is given to junior applicants or individuals that have not previously held the grant. For individuals that have held the same grant before, the result of their earlier stay will be considered together with the application.

The grant should cover costs for travels to Turkey and a stay of at least one month at the Swedish Research Institute in Istanbul during the fall semester of 2019. Grant holders staying in Istanbul are provided with a guest room, free of cost, at the institute, located within the compound of the Swedish consulate general in Istanbul. The grant holder is expected to participate in daily activities at the institute, present his or her research at one of the seminars arranged by the institute, and submit a written report, in the form of a personal presentation in the institute bulletin, at the end of the semester. The grant must be used during the fall semester and will otherwise be refunded.

The application must include a list of grades of accomplished tests and courses, a certificate from the supervisor, and a working plan and time specification of the stay in Turkey. The application should be sent as **one** file (word or pdf) to the Board of the Swedish Research Institute in Istanbul on the e-mail address sriapplication@gmail.com **before March 31, 2019**. Incomplete applications will not be considered for grants.
