Research Grant in Turkish languages or Turkology

The board of the SWEDISH RESEARCH INSTITUTE IN ISTANBUL hereby announces a fellowship grant of **12000 SEK** for the **spring term of 2019**.

The grant is awarded to Candidate or Master students in Turkish languages or Turkology at Swedish or Nordic universities, who are preparing or working on a thesis. The grant should cover costs for travels to Turkey and a stay of at least one month at the Swedish Research Institute in Istanbul during the spring semester of 2019. Grant holders staying in Istanbul are provided with a guest room, free of cost, at the institute, located within the compound of the Swedish consulate general in Istanbul. The grant holder is expected to participate in daily activities at the institute and present his or her research at one of the seminars arranged by the institute.

The grant must be used during the fall semester and will otherwise be refunded. The grant holder should leave a written report within three months after the fellowship period has ended, describing the work that has been done, the results it has brought and its importance for his or her studies. Applicants that have received an earlier grant must have handed in their reports in due time before they re-apply. Applicants that have not held any grant before are given priority.

The application must include a list of grades of accomplished tests and courses, a certificate from the supervisor, and a working plan and time specification of the stay in Turkey.

The application should be sent as **one** file (word or pdf) to the board of the Swedish Research Institute in Istanbul (sriiapplication@gmail.com) **before October 26, 2018**. Incomplete applications will not be considered for grants.
