

The Ottoman Empire registered a great number of documents in its time, and retained an array of historical sources about Europe, Asia, Anatolia, the Middle East and North Africa. Since the beginning of the Empire, Ottoman sources were retained and some of them survived until this day. For those who are interested in analyzing these significant documents, the Swedish Research Institute in Istanbul has prepared an Archive Guide which aims to inform both Turkish and foreign scholars about the Turkish Archives in Istanbul. The main goal of this guide is to explain how to gain access to the Archives, including what the requirements are and where the archives are located. In this way, SRII presents general information in this brochure to facilitate for much more reliable and easier research in Istanbul.

We would like to thank the library executives of ISAM, IRCICA and Süleymaniye Manuscript Library and Directorates of the archives for the contributions that they made for this brochure. *Working hours of the archives and libraries may change due to the holidays.



Description

IRCICA library offers complete access to digitized copies of over one and a half million images free on its website. In the system, readers have the ability to translate the digitized copies into several languages, listen to audio, or annotate the images, among other accessibilities. IRCICA library has various sources of the manuscripts from the late Ottoman era, newspapers from the Ottoman language (Takvim-i Vekay-i) and a topography archive which is about Anatolia.

How to apply



IRCICA is one step closer now! The building is in Fatih region. To be able to get there, you have to take Kabataş-Bağcılar tramline in Kabataş station and then get off at Gülhane station and walk along the ramp. The enterance is only allowed in Bab-I Ali gate.

Description

Since its foundation, the Ottoman Empire had given great importance to registering records. The first attempt to create a modern archive was made by Grand Vizier Mustafa Reşid Pasha in 1846. The main purpose of this organization is to gather all three state archives under the same establishment. (The Ottoman Archives, the Republican Archives (Ankara) and Documentation). Application and research processes are the same for three institutions.

How to apply

- Scholars may apply directly, by filling out the "Application Form" (see translated application 1.1) both at the archives and at Turkish Foreign embassies & consulates in their countries. (The result of the application through the Embassies and Consulates will be finalized within two weeks.)

Description

Süleymanive library was founded in 1918 and contains over 100.000 manuscripts and presents them to its readers in a digitized catalogue. Although main sources of the library are based upon Islamic works, the collection has sources from logic, rhetoric, grammar and other disciplines. The Süleymaniye Library is connected to four other libraries which are Atıf Efendi, Köprülü, Nuruosmaniye and Ragip Paşa manuscript libraries.

How to apply

- Application process is valid for all the four libraries. Owing to the fact that all the manuscripts were digitized, research sources can be provided either physical or digital copies. In order to get those copies from the Süleymaniye Library and the other libraries that are connected to the Directorate of Manuscripts, you have to fill out the "CD Request Form".
- The easiest way to reach the library is using tramline. If you take the tramline, get off the "Beyazıt stop" and then walk Beyazıt square. Take the street that is to the left of the



Description

In the Ottoman era, the heart of the government was Topkapı Palace. To this respect, all the significant documents were kept and registered in the Topkapı archives. Recently, the majority of the collection was transferred to the Ottoman Archives. Yet, the museum's collections still preserves the most important records. Today, Topkapı Palace Museum Collections is able to provide an online catalogue system to its researchers.

Description

The ISAM library was established in 1984, is one of the most important libraries focusing on Islamic & Ottoman Studies as well as in the social sciences in Turkey. The library has a vast collection in a great variety of social science areas, including Islamic culture, history and societies as well as Turkish history, culture and literature.

How to apply

To be able to get a membership, researchers must be post-graduate students or PhD students and teaching staff at a university. For application researchers need:

• One passport size photograph

• Updated student document stating that the applicant is continuing in post-graduate or Phd studies

• If the post-graduate or PhD studies have been completed, then a photocopy of the diploma or graduation document must be provided.

Photocopy of teaching staff identification

• The "Readers" Application Form", can be obtained from the Library front desk, which must be filled out.


From Taksim - The quickest way will be using M2 Taksim Hacrosman metroline. Get off in Gayrettepe Station and get in the bus 500A in Köprülü Kavşak station. Three stations later, you have to get off in Bağlarbaşı Station. By walking five minutes, you will finally reach ISAM.

Topkapi Palace Museum Collections

Museum Collections are divided into two parts - the manuscript library which can be visited during the working hours. The other part is the archive, which foreign researchers have to send a letter which explains the reason for requesting the document. The letter should be sent via e-mail, after the admission of the application, researchers are required to get an appointment to have the documents.

From Taksim, you can use the bus 46H and get off in the Beyazıt station or you can use the Tunnel subway ine and get off in Karaköy

T1 (Istanbul Tram): take the Kabataş-Bağcılar tramline which goes to "Sultanahmet station".
